Currently, the Institute is inviting submissions for the next edition of The Journal. The selection of topics will be at the discretion of the author and submissions must be available to be published including in the Institute’s publications and on its website.

If you are interested in submitting a paper for consideration, please note the following criteria apply:

- The Author(s)’ details including name, postnominals, position, organisation and other relevant information (50 words or less) in the first footnote of the manuscript.
- Provide an abstract of the manuscript (60 – 100 words) to be included at the beginning of the published submission.
- Word length of 3000 – 5000 words for articles, 1000 – 2000 words for case notes, and 750 – 1000 words for book review. Case notes should provide a brief outline of the facts and judgements together with evaluation and analysis of the importance of the decision for ADR.
- Authors are to refer to the citation guide as per the Australia Guide to Legal Citation, [click here](#) to view the guide online.
- The Manuscript should be in its final form and authors are totally responsible for the accuracy of case names, citations and other references including spelling judges’ names, accuracy of quotations, etc.
- It is assumed that submissions have not been sent to another publisher or journal or that the material published in the journal has not been already published elsewhere. Please inform the Editor if the article has been submitted to another publisher or journal.
